

History of the Play

A fter several years of planning and nurturing by Rosebud School of the Arts, The Canadian Badlands Passion Play Society was formed in 1990. The name *Canadian Badlands* was deliberately chosen because this Play was to be set in the *Badlands* because of its topographical similarity to the Isreali country-side around Jerusalem, and was seen as Drumheller's gift to Canada: *The Canadian Badlands Passion Play*.

Over the years the amphitheatre seating has increased to hold over 2500 people. The staging area has seen the continual addition of set pieces and props. The first phase of the Jerusalem Wall serves as an anchor for volunteer and guest services, and this summer

the upper floor gallery hosts a wonderful display of artwork and interpretive items. The acting company draws in amateurs and professionals from across the province and around the world. Choirs practice in many communities, and Drumheller volunteers mobilize to host this annual event.

What media is saying ...

Today you will see our progress towards achieving this dream. With the assistance of thousands of volunteers and donors, this barren piece of Badlands has been transformed into a site where the Story of Jesus is brought to life. We are transported back two thousand years to a place and time that changed the course of history and continues to change lives.

The story that we are portraying predates Christianity and the two thousand intervening years that have added an overburden of religious practices, theological differences, cultural interpretations, and social developments that now separate us from the life and times of Jesus. We have researched the cultures, customs, and writ-

> ings that are distilled in the stories of Jesus as told by His companions Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. In doing so, we have touched, and have been touched by a Mystery and Power that defies verbal description. We have resorted to theatre to bring Jesus' story to life knowing that our best is but a shadow of that Mystery.


"...it's a profoundly moving entertainment which uses its very substantial strengths to great advantage.

The most obvious of these strengths is, of course, the landscape. I doubt there's another place on earth that's more perfectly suited to a passion play. The badlands uncannily evoke the stark, dramatic countryside around Jerusalem. The play is performed on a broad stage in a dramatic canyon, and the surrounding hills are perfect for providing hiding places for offstage actors and effecting dramatic entrances. The ampitheatre-style seating seamlessly echoes the layered sediment of the facing coulees, and culminates in a raised section for a two-hundred-person choir that floats behind the audience like a heavenly host.

Best of all, the company, which has been presenting the passion for thirteen years, makes excellent use of these gifts. The staging is full of texture and movement, and the frequent audience cries of "look over there!" attest to how much is going on. The direction of the many crowd scenes, too, is first-rate. The crowd ebbs and flows like a character in itself, and the actors as a group perform a pair of stunning but low-tech special effects that would make Robert Lepage weep with envy."





The Travelling "One-Man Passion Play"



For five years now, our artistic director, Randall Wiebe, has been travelling the globe telling the same gospel story we tell in our amphitheatre. The difference is, he does it alone.

That's right – he performs a one-man Passion Play! And in case you think that might be a little lonely, he has this to say, with a smile on his face. "Yes, it's just me, but I play about 12 different characters, so I'm never really alone."

What inspired this unique venture? "I'd been involved in almost all aspects of the Passion Play in Drumheller. I wrote a previous script that was used for ten years. I acted a variety of small roles. I even directed one year, but the greatest experience of all was getting to play the role of Jesus for two years. After that, I just couldn't

imagine myself not being involved in a dramatic retelling of the story of his life."

So in 2003, Randall wrote and produced a one-man show of the Passion of Christ, told through the eyes of the apostle Thomas. Why him? "Firstly, he's the disciple I probably relate to the most personally. He had a hard time believing in something if he couldn't hold it in his hands. And I'd always thought that Thomas got a bad rap – 'Doubting Thomas!' – when many other people I read about in the Bible went through their own periods of doubt. A story about him also naturally creates the theme of faith versus doubt. And as I studied more about Thomas, I came to realize that he probably wasn't exactly the man I always thought that he was – so that gave the opportunity to include a few surprises."

Originally, the play was performed for small audiences on the Passion Play site who followed "Thomas" around the stage to actually be "in" the places he talked about. He still performs here on some summer evenings, but now with just a bench and his costume he travels around telling the same story. So who does Randall perform Thomas for? "It has been a really exciting journey – literally. I have had the chance to perform Thomas not just in churches across Western Canada, but many interesting places around the world... from youth camps in northern BC to senior's conventions in southern Saskatchewan, from a birthday party in Calgary to a prison in Guam, from a performance for a thousand people to a performance for one person, from a ball diamond in Clive, Alberta to 17 performances in 18 days in 5 different provinces of Malaysia" — a total of more than 300 performances.

What keeps him going? "The story does. It is truth. The most important truth you can tell. And as I am faithful to tell it, God is faithful in helping me to do it."



(*Mt* 8:2-4, *Mk* 1:39-45, *Lk* 5:12-15) Near the Sea of Galilee — A leper comes to Jesus to be healed of an incurable disease.

Healing a Paralyzed Man

(*Mt* 9:1-8, *Mk* 2:1-12, *Lk* 5:17-26) Capernaum — Jesus is in a room so crowded that the friends of a paralytic lower him through the roof so that he can be healed.

The Calling of Matthew (*Mt 9:9, Mk 2:14, Lk 5:27-29*) Galilee — Jesus calls Matthew, a despised tax collector, to follow him.

Matthew's Feast

(*Mt* 9:10-18, *Mk* 2:15-22, *Lk* 5:30-39) Galilee — Matthew throws a feast for Jesus and his followers, but the religious leaders object to the company which Jesus keeps.

Man With a Withered Hand

(*Mt 12:9-14*, *Mk 3:1-6*, *Lk 6:6-11*) Capernaum — Against the opposition of the religious leaders, Jesus heals a man's shriveled hand on the Sabbath.

Man of the Tombs (*Mk* 5:1-20, *Lk* 8:26-39)

Region of the Gerasenes, East Shore of the Sea of Galilee — A man possessed by many demons is set free by Jesus.

The Sermon on the Mount (*Mt* 5:2-12, *Mt* 14:13-21, *Mk* 6:30-44, *Lk* 8:5-8, *Lk* 9:10-17, *Jn* 6:1-15) A Mountain near the Sea of Galilee — Jesus teaches the crowds the paradox of the Kingdom.

Healing a Woman / My Little Daughter is Dying

(*Mt* 9:18-26, *Mk* 5:21-43, *Lk* 8:40-56) Capernaum — While going to the house of a ruler of the synagogue to heal his daughter, Jesus is delayed by the touch of a sick woman.

(*Mt* 14:6-11, *Mk* 6:21-28, *Lk* 9:7-9) Herod's Palace — When the daughter of Herodias pleases Herod with her dancing, he promises her a gift, which leads to the beheading of John the Baptist.

Galilee — Jesus sends out his disciples to minister with teaching and healing.

The Play's Locale

The setting of our play is, by Canadian standards, small. Only 450 kilometres long by 120 kilometres wide (the size of Alberta south of Lethbridge) Israel contains a surprisingly wide variety of geography, some of which looks amazingly like the site of our play.

The events in the play took place all across this tiny country. In the play we are unable to portray the movement from region to region, which though small by today's standards was significant in an era when most travel was by foot. In the play descriptions we have included locales, so that using this map, you will be able to get a better idea of where everything actually took place.

We have done our best to create a play that summarizes the last few years of Jesus' life, the first act occuring in Galilee in the north, and the second act in Jerusalem, in Judea in the south.






